Note: Rider/Owner must be full members of USEF and participating or business members of USDF. Horse must be Lifetime or annual recorded with USEF and have Lifetime horse registration with USDF.

ENTRY FEE SCHEDULE

ENTRIES: You may use equestrian entries to enter online. Please use USEF/CDS entry form that can be found at www.fairwindfarm.com or www.californiadressage.org. All entries must be postmarked by the closing date, or a late fee of \$20 will be charged per entry. Show management may close entries early if the show is filled. Entries must be filled out completely, a \$20 fee will apply to all incomplete entries. **EACH ENTRY MUST INCLUDE A COPY OF ALL MEMBERSHIP CARDS (USEF/USDF/CDS)** for horse/rider and owner/trainer and coach, as indicated on the form. Make checks payable to Fairwind Farm. If competitors check is returned a \$35 bank fee will be charged, any account left unpaid will be turned over to USEF for further action.

ENTRY FEES PER CLASS

USDF Introductory level - \$35 per test

Training - Fourth level - \$55 per test

FEI classes - \$60 per test

USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES add \$15 per class fee.

Entry changes after closing date \$15

Incomplete entry fee \$20

Late entry fee \$20 accepted if space is available

MANDATORY ENTRY FEES PER HORSE:USEF drug fee \$23, CDFA drug fee \$5, Office fee \$25, CDS Travel Grant fee \$3, Grounds fee \$20 per horse.

FREESTYLE entries must send copy of eligibility test with entry. Freestyle music must be on compact disc, please give to show secretary upon check in or on show day.

SCRATCHES AND CANCELLATIONS: It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the show secretary of intention to scratch. Scratches before the closing date, will have fees refunded less the office fee. **NO REFUNDS AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.** Show cancellation or reschedule for a rain date will not be refunded.

RIDE TIMES will be emailed and posted on the Wednesday before the show date at www.fairwindfarm.com or www.foxvillage.com. It is the responsibility of the rider to call the show secretary if ride times cannot be found online. Riders should be prepared to ride at any time, as classes may need to be scheduled out of order. **PLEASE SUBMIT A LEGIBLE EMAIL ADDRESS.**

AWARDS: Ribbons 1st-6th, Prize to 1st. Ribbons for high score for FEI, AA, Open and Jr/YR, and best turnout, early entry. Lots of prizes will be available. Eight **HIGHPOINT Awards FOR OPEN/AA/JR-YR and FEI.**

ARENAS & FOOTING: All tests will be ridden in 20x60 meter nike/sand arenas. One warm-up arena, covered, another slightly smaller. Only competition horses in arena during competition.

PARKING: Plentiful and easy!

STABLING: Limited permanent 12x12 stalls with doors at \$40/day or \$80 for the weekend (includes \$20 grounds fee).

Extra shavings \$10 per bag. Hay and Grain not provided but will feed hay provided by horse owner if left in front of stall. Send in stabling request with entry.

VET AND FARRIER:On call, numbers posted in show office.

FOOD: Available throughout the show

DOGS: Allowed on grounds but **MUST** be on a leash attached to a person or a fine of \$50 will be assessed.

DIRECTIONS TO FAIRWIND: 2276 Crane Canyon Rd, Santa Rosa, CA. 101 to Rohnert park expressway, East to Petaluma Hill Rd, left on Petaluma Hill to Crane Canyon, East (right) to 2276 Crane Canyon on right, just after cul-de-sac sign. About 2.4 miles.

IMPORTANT NOTE: USEF rule DR. 120.6 , **“From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.”**

ALL entries must be completely filled in with all required numbers and signatures. **COPIES OF APPROPRIATE USEF/USDF/CDS CARDS AND HORSE REGISTRATIONS (ENTRY NAMES MUST MATCH FEDERATION CARD NAMES) MUST BE INCLUDED WITH ENTRY OR ENTRY WILL BE CONSIDERED INCOMPLETE. INCORRECT, OR INCOMPLETE ENTRIES MAY BE CHARGED \$20 PER CORRECTION, OR MAY NOT BE ACCEPTED. PLEASE SEND IN ONE ENTRY PER HORSE/RIDER FOR SHOW. ENTRIES ARE NOT COMPLETE UNTIL ALL OF THE ABOVE IS SATISFIED.**

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION
PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. **RULES:** This show is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and judged in accordance therewith. It is up to competitors to know, understand, and follow competition rules.
2. **MANAGEMENT:** The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and to cancel/award prizes, without claim to damage, to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute officials. The Judges decisions are strictly their own and the Management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
3. **ENTRIES:** All entries must be postmarked by the closing date. The show management may close entries early if the show is full. Entries must be filled out completely, signed by rider, owner, trainer and coach and have proper fees enclosed. Junior riders (under 18 years old) must have the parent or guardian sign the release. No numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and CURRENT copies of ALL registration cards. Fee of \$20 will be charged if all cards are not attached.
4. **SCRATCHES AND CANCELLATIONS:** It is the responsibility of competitor to inform the show secretary 530 695-0509 of intention to scratch. Scratches made before the closing date will be refunded less the office fee. NO REFUNDS AFTER THE CLOSING DATE. No refunds will be given for cancellation of show due to weather or other situation not within show management's control.
5. **FREESTYLES:** Freestyle entries must send a copy of eligibility test with entry. Freestyle music must be on CD. Please give to Show Secretary upon check-in on show day. Sound check will be held daily at the first break.
6. **PONY MEASUREMENT:** Competitors wishing to have their scores count for pony awards must include a current pony measurement card with their entry. If the competitor wants to have their pony measured at the show, they must let management know in advance so that a time can be arranged with the Vet. Competitor is responsible for all Vet call charges.
7. **RIDE TIMES:** Times will be emailed and posted on the Fairwind Farm website www.Fairwindfarm.com. Please submit a legible valid email address with entry. It is the rider's responsibility to inform management if times are not received. Riders should be prepared to ride at any time as classes may need to be scheduled out of order.
8. **ARENAS and FOOTING:** Show arena is outdoors and is standard regulation size (20m x 60m) overall dimensions approximately 100' X 240', and has sand/rubber footing mix. Warm up arena may be indoors or outdoors as necessary with similar footing.
9. **AWARDS:** Ribbons through 6th place Awards to 1st place. High Score Award for Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider and Open.
10. **STABLING:** Limited permanent 12 x 12 stalls with doors available. See Fee List on page 2. Additional shavings \$10 per bag. Competitor is responsible for feed/hay.
11. **SHARPS CONTAINERS:** GR1210.4. Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

12. **VET & FARRIER:** On call. Phone numbers will be posted at the show office.

13. **LUNGING:** Absolutely no lunging in the warm up arena. Lunging allowed in designated lunging arenas only.

14. **FOOD:** Breakfast & lunch will be available on the grounds throughout the show.

15. **DOGS:** Please leave dogs at home. 2011 GR1301.6 USEF Rules apply. Please review.
